

New Federal Program Helping Households Get Internet Service



AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

What does the program provide?

- * A **discount of up to \$30 per month** toward internet for eligible households
- * A **discount of up to \$75 per month** for homes on qualifying Tribal lands
- * Eligible households can also receive a **one-time discount of up to \$100** to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

If my household qualifies, how do we access the benefits?

There are just **2 Steps to Enroll**:

1. Go to [AffordableConnectivity.gov](https://www.AffordableConnectivity.gov) to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.
2. Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Eligible households must complete BOTH steps to receive benefits.

How does my household qualify for the program?

Household income is **at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines**

OR

A member of the household **meets at least one** of the following criteria:

- * Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- * Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income internet program;
- * Participates in one of these assistance programs:
 - The National School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision;
 - SNAP;
 - Medicaid;
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance;
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI);
 - WIC;
 - Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits;
 - or Lifeline.
